WELCOME TO FIRST GRADE!

Dear Families,

Summer is here, and we are happy to welcome your child to First Grade! In preparation for the coming year, we ask that your child completes the following tasks over the summer. We do not want your child to lose any of the valuable skills that they learned in Kindergarten this past year. It is so important to review the skills consistently, and to read, read!

Sight Words – Your child is expected to know all of the sight words learned in Kindergarten and will be assessed on the list during the first week of school. A list of the Kindergarten words is attached.

Math—Your child should know all addition and subtraction facts from 0-5 and will be assessed on them during the first trimester of school. They must also complete the attached math packet and hand it in on the first day of school.

Summer Reading - We would like each child to read two required books and complete the included pages during the summer. These assignments will be counted towards your child's first trimester grade and will be graded on completion, penmanship, effort and neatness.

Please have your child read:

- How Rocket Learned to Read by Tad Hills and complete the attached pages. (Please
 do not print the First, Next, Then, Last page or the drawing page back to back as these
 will be hung on our bulletin boards.)
- A Garden to Save the Birds by Wendy McClure and complete the attached assignment.

Daily Reading- We ask that each child read for at least 60 minutes per week. While there is no log to complete, THIS IS PROBABLY THE MOST IMPORTANT THING YOU CAN DO FOR YOUR INCOMING FIRST GRADER (other than having a fun summer of course.) If you would like book suggestions, Google 'First Grade Book Lists' and choose books appropriate for your child.

Your child will need a snack or pretzel money for morning recess. Please keep in mind that the snack will be eaten outside at recess, so it should be separate from their lunch. First Grade does not have an afternoon snack. On the first day of school your child must provide a note stating how he/she will normally go home throughout the year. For example, Radnor - Bus #, Walkers, Car riders, or CARES. During the school year, if your child is going home a different way, a note or email must be sent to the teacher.

Listed below are the supplies needed for the first day of school. Please label everything -supplies, sweatshirts, lunch boxes, water bottles, etc.

We kindly ask that you stick to the specific supply list below. Please do not send extra classroom or student items as we do not have the space for them. If or when we need more items, we will let you know.

One 4x6 or 5x7 picture of just your child to be displayed in the classroom throughout the year
1 pack of 100 3x5 index cards (not on rings)
6 STURDY plastic 2 pocket folders
A pair of kids scissors
4 large glue sticks
One box (12) of colored pencils
One box (24) of crayons
One box (10) of thin markers
One highlighter
At least 6 SHARPENED pencils
1 box of tissues
1 tube of Clorox wipes
1 roll of paper towels
1 large box of quart size "SLIDER" storage bags

Other items, such as supply boxes, pencil cases and copybooks will be distributed to each child on the first day of school. (These were paid for in the supply fee.)
